
Series-movers Tourneys: Technical Excellence Challenge

StrateGems is announcing a series of challenges in composing series-movers. The idea is to revitalize this genre and showcase composers' technical excellence. In each issue a new theme will be announced (a total of four themes is planned). The composers will have four months to compose the problem(s). The entries must be emailed to the director, Mike Prcic (Tuzlak@aol.com). The judge is Dragan Stojnić, International Judge FIDE. The results of the first challenge will be published in SG96. The winner in each category will receive 6 points. In case of a tie, the points will be divided equaly. The points will be added after each challenge and the overall winner announced at the end. The top six composers will receive prizes in books and free electronic subscriptions to SG.

The first challenge: Ser-h= with double excelsior with the least number of moves. Only the new records will be considered for the competition.

If two entries have the same number of moves, then additional criteria will be considered such as the number of pieces. In the case of an equal number of pieces, additional criteria will be considered: the type of pieces with the least number of point: Q=10, R=5, B/S=3 and P=1. Illegal settings, promoted pieces and King-in-check are not allowed. Promoted Bishop is allowed only if there is none already existing on the squares of the same color (one set rule) but it is discouraged. Previously published works that have been improved will be allowed.

Here are the current records for various combinations of promoted pieces (to the best of our knowledge).







November 1st 2021 deadline for submitting the second challenge entries

SG97 January 2022 issue: Announcement of the winners of the second challenge and fourth challenge announcement

February 1st 2022 deadline for submitting the third challenge entries

SG98 April 2022 issue: Announcement of the winners of the third challenge

May 1st 2022 deadline for submitting the fourth challenge entries

SG99 July 2022 issue: Announcement of the winners of the fourth challenge as well as the overall winners.
